Students shall develop their knowledge of philosophy and history and philosophy; and they may also become more self-aware when arriving to the points of decision during their artistic activity.

The lectures are centered around the philosophical implications of our everyday lives as social animals. In the end of the semester we also analyse the work of Albert Camus.
